Dear Parents,

School Council Elections

School Council elections are held in February/March each year with each School Councillor being appointed for a two year term. Approximately half of the current School Council positions are advertised as vacant each year.

Parent School Council members who have completed their current two year term of office are Jane Compton-Robins and Aisha Aslam. Kerryn Holland and Robyn Harrison have completed twelve month terms as co-opted community members. They are joined by Patricia McAuley who has completed her two year term as a Department of Education and Training (DET) representative. Urva Ghandi resigned as a parent representative last year which has created a casual 12 month vacancy. On behalf of Thomastown Primary School, I would like to extend our very warm thanks to all our retiring members of School Council.

The composition of the Thomastown Primary School Council is agreed by negotiation with DET and cannot be changed without DET approval. The current composition of the TPS School Council is:

- 5 parent members
- 4 DET members (includes Principal)
- 3 co-opted community members
- *** Parents in paid employment with DET count as a DET member

There are currently two (2) vacancies for parent members, three (3) for community co-opted members and one (1) for DET members. Each of the positions is for a period of two years. There is also one (1) 12 month parent vacancy due to the resignation of a parent representative. The 12 month vacancy will be filled by co-option.

School Council meetings are held during the first week of each month with a minimum requirement of eight meetings each year. In 2016, School Council meetings were held at 5:15pm on the first Wednesday of each month. The timing of the meetings is negotiated with the new School Council each year.

It is very important that the school continue to have an active School Council. If you are interested in nominating for School Council, please take the time to speak to current school councillors and ask them about the role and what it means to the life of the school. I am also available to answer questions from those who are interested but unsure of what to expect.

If you decide to stand for election, you will need to arrange for someone to nominate and second you as a candidate in either the parent or DET employee category or you can nominate yourself. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the Principal within the time limit stated on the Notice of Election.

If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted after the Call for Nominations has closed. At this point I will then ask all candidates to provide a brief written profile about themselves.

Nomination forms will be available from the office on Monday 20^h February 2017 Please take note of the closing date for nominations – Monday 6^h March 2017 at 4 pm.




